- State what the theme "Together We Rise Durham" means to you? You can answer this question as it pertains to you as a resident of Durham, as a member/ally of the Black community, and/or as it relates to you or your business/organization.
- 20 to 60 seconds in length max
- MP4 or MOV format
- Groups or persons representing a workplace must receive permission from their management team before submitting

Community Video Submissions

THE PROCESS:

• Please film yourselves via a camera, webcam or your phone. If you choose to use a cell phone, please ensure that you film holding the phone in the landscape position (see image for example).



- Ensure that the subject is in the centre of the frame, shoulder height and above and is well lit.
- If an external mic is not being used to record audio, please ensure that the subject is in a fairly quiet area where there is little to no noise in the background. If filming outside, please select an area with little to no wind disruption.
- Begin the video by stating the theme "Together We Rise, Durham".
- State your name and (if applicable) your business/organization
- In a concise manner, explain what the theme "Together We Rise Durham" means to you. You can answer this question as it pertains to you as a resident of Durham, as a member/ally of the Black community, and/or as it relates to you or your business/organization.
- Ensure that the video is no longer that 60 seconds in length (20-60s is preferred)
- MP4 or MOV format
- Groups or persons representing a workplace must receive permission from their management team before submitting.
